Built originally in 1890, Guigues School has long been a landmark in the Lower Town section of Ottawa. An addition to the school was built in 1904. At present there are 18 class rooms in the building, and the enrollment averages around 800 pupils,

retary of the Separate School Board, said the four third-floor classrooms at the west end of the building had been virtually destroyed. He said the roof had heen burned through over the four rooms and that there was heavy damage to classrooms be-

The lower hall of the building was completely awash with an inch of water at the height of

It was the second fire in the school in past years. About a year ago, following an evening meeting of the Separate School Board, Aime Arvisais, secretary, discovered a fire in a first floor room reportedly started by a short circuit. This was nipped in the bud with comparatively little damage.
